Originally chartered in 1946, the Gamma Kappa Chapter was reestablished at George Washington on March 25; 91 women were initiated, including four legacies. "It was a life-changing experience to become sisters with so many amazing women and to be able to officially bring Theta to my campus," said new initiate Morgan Caldwell.

The badge that will be worn by Gamma Kappa's chief executive officer was retrieved from Theta's archival collection. It belonged to Marjorie Tiehnor Carpenter, who in 1947 was the twentieth member to be initiated by Gamma Kappa Chapter.

Located primarily in the Foggy Bottom neighborhood of Washington, DC, George Washington is a private research university. Many alumni have served in high positions within both the US and foreign governments. Theta will join 10 Panhellenic sororities, seven historically African-America fraternities and sororities, and eight culturally based Greek organizations.
