Eighty-seven young women signed the charter for the Epsilon Psi Chapter of Kappa Alpha Theta May 3. This charter was later presented by Grand President Sue Supple at the installation banquet.

The charter members of Epsilon Psi began their pledgeship on February 14. Under the supervision of Chapter Consultant Karen Rathgeber, the colony immediately began getting to know one another and forming strong bonds to make the chapter the best possible.

The first group event was a retreat to Virginia Beach, where pledges flew kites, played volleyball and conversed over lunch. It was a cold and blustery day, but also one of new-found friends and fun.

At the beginning of the chapter's pledge period, each young woman was given a Secret Sister to whom she sent notes and gifts. After about three weeks, they met their sisters at an ice cream party. This was followed by Spirit Chairman Libby Zaidel's plan for Birthday Buddies and Study Buddies. Each group of buddies consisted of four women who got to know one another better by studying together or going out for a meal.

Other highlights of the Epsilon Psi pledgeship were socials and mixers with other sororities and fraternities, and a faculty tea at which Kappa Alpha Theta was introduced to faculty members.

As initiation time grew closer, so did the Epsilon Psi pledges. The general consensus was that Theta had brought many more friends into each woman's life, and that each felt a special bond to the oth-
