The 87-woman local sorority on the UC-Davis campus, Beta Kappa Phi, selected Kappa Alpha Theta!

After a week of presentations and three years of planning, the members of Beta Kappa Phi finally realized their dream of affiliating with an international women's fraternity. "We wanted to build from the ground up," states Malou Guervara, founding member of Beta Kappa Phi.

Founded in 1989, the chapter gained new members and success quickly. They won Derby Days twice, placed second in Anchor Splash and planned and presented a Greek leadership seminar for the campus Panhellenic Council. The dedicated group wrote its own constitution, obtained chapter insurance, was admitted as an associate member of the UC-Davis Panhellenic Council and produced a chapter newsletter each quarter.

Beta Kappa Phi demonstrated its commitment and energy by participating extensively in community service. They selected the Society for the Prevention of



Cruelty to Animals as their chapter philanthropy, while still supporting a variety of organizations in the Davis community. Chapter members assisted the Yolo County S.P.C.A. by walking dogs, staffing the shelter and working in a thrift store benefiting the shelter. Members also participated in Project Play Park, a one-day, city-wide event that built play equipment for a Davis park. Continuing their support of Davis City Parks and Recreation, members will paint park benches this spring. As a chapter of Kappa Alpha Theta, the group looks forward to assisting the Sacramento CASA organization.

Individual achievements mirror the group's success. Sarah Hurlston and Lisa Kelly both achieved the highest GPA for junior and sophomore engineering majors respectively, while Christy Austin is a member of Phi Beta Kappa. The chapter also takes pride in its members who participate on UC-Davis athletic teams: Julie Astrachan (softball), Alison Vidal (tennis), Jolene Bachman (volleyball) and Zeina Asfour (waterpolo).

Pledged on February 24, 1992, the members of Beta Kappa Phi became members of Zeta Nu Colony of Kappa Alpha Theta. Chapter Consultant Toril Milbrath educated the colony members using the Fraternity's Member Orientation Program. Following completion of the program, Zeta Nu was ready for the installation weekend. Grand President Janet Paine Peters and the installation team led the initiation and charter services April 9-11, 1992, assisted by the women of Omega/UC-Berkeley. The weekend began with the alumnae initiates' Pledge Service and the Loyalty Service at the City Hall Council Chambers. A reception followed where colony members opened installation gifts and read congratulatory letters. On Friday, colony members were initiated at the
